# **Holy Family**

#### Let the children come to me


As we prepare our 2nd grade students for 1st Communion, I reminded parents this month to be sure to bring their children to mass as we will be discussing parts of the mass and it helps that they see it before we discuss it. Some may say young children shouldn't be at mass. But that isn't true. Jesus said in the Gospel of Matthew ""Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

When they are baptized, the children, become part of God's family, the Church community. Just like other family gatherings, they should be welcomed.

So what are some ways that we can help these little ones get more from mass.

- Read the Gospel and talk to them about it before coming to mass. This could be done throughout the week. It is a great family activity. This will help them understand it better before they get to mass.
- Consider sitting closer to the front of church. Imagine being a little one and adults are all around you. You can't really see what is going on. It would be easy to get distracted or uninvolved if you could only see someone's back.
- Ask your child to especially pay attention to a part of the mass each week. Then as a family discuss what they saw and heard and the importance of it.
- Talk about why it is so important to come to mass on Sunday and spend time with Jesus.

Finally, remember to pray for and with your children. You are their primary educators of the faith. They learn from you how important the mass should be in their lives.



#### Lent

The first twenty five days of February fall during the liturgical season known as Ordinary Time which is represented by the liturgical color green. Green, the symbol of hope, is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. The remaining days of February are the beginning of Lent. The liturgical color changes to purple — a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart.

Wednesday, February 26th, is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Lenten Season. It is a day of fasting and abstinence.

- The Law of Fasting (which binds those from age 18 through 59) allows only one full meal and two lighter meals in the course of the day, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.
- The Law of Abstinence (which binds those of 14 year's and over) forbids the eating of meat. By doing these and other penances we can realize that interior change of heart is so necessary for all Christians. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is sinful.
