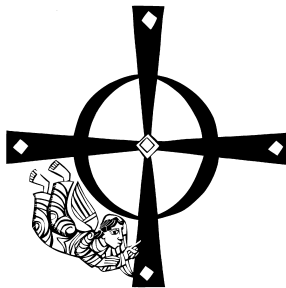
Toccata in F Major [First Section]
